It occurs on the first Friday of February each year as part of National Children's Dental Health Month. GKAS provides an invaluable service to children as well as providing a hands-on volunteer experience and education for dental professionals.

CE Objectives for GKAS Volunteering Dentists

Participating dentists will:

- Experience volunteer dentistry.
- Diagnose and provide treatment (restorative and extensive) to pediatric patients.
- Experience working with the underserved population.
- Experience the challenge of language barriers in the dental treatment setting.
- Develop an appreciation of the dental access-to-care situation in Colorado.
- Develop an appreciation of the struggle that many families experience to achieve basic dental care.
- Provide education and prevention information to underserved families and children of all ages and cultural backgrounds.
