








What was that? Did you hear that?

He has been recognized as a comedian, artist, writer, teacher and humanitarian.



Hurts So Good! Management of Dental Pain and Appropriate Opioid Prescribing Practices

Presented by Thomas Viola, RPh., C.C.P.

Saturday, June 8, 2019, 9 a.m.-Noon CE Credit Hours: 3

Course Synopsis:

Management of acute dental pain is accomplished through a clinical approach that successfully incorporates opioid and non-opioid analgesics. However, this normally occurs outside the dental office, away from our immediate supervision and we are often faced with the difficult task of managing patient pain while also avoiding adverse outcomes for both our patient and our communities. Thus, it is critical for clinicians to accurately identify the need for pain control and associated risks, and to assess the efficacy of analgesic agents to be administered. This program will provide an overview of effective dental pain management and identification of addiction. Special emphasis will also be given to a discussion of purported uses of cannabis in pain control and appropriate opioid prescribing.

Learning Objectives:

- Describe the pharmacology and mechanism of action of opioid and non-opioid analgesics.
- Explain the intended role of opioid and nonopioid analgesics in the management of acute dental pain, as well as situations which may preclude their use, based on a patient's underlying medical conditions.
- Explore the purported role of cannabis, with and without opioid analgesics, in the management of acute dental pain.
- Discuss appropriate prescribing practices for opioid analgesics to utilize in everyday clinical situations.

About the Speaker: Thomas Viola, R.Ph., C.C.P., the founder of "Pharmacology Declassified," is a board-certified pharmacist who also serves the profession of dentistry as a clinical educator, professional speaker and published author. Tom is a member of the faculty of 10 dental professional degree programs and has received several awards for outstanding teacher of the year. Tom has presented hundreds of continuing education courses to dental professionals, nationally and internationally, in the areas of oral pharmacology and local anesthesia and is well-known for his regular contributions to several dental professional journals. Assessment of Apnea/ Pre-Apnea in the Pediatric Dental Patient: Then what?

Course Synopsis:

Poorly aligned teeth and jaws are rarely found in pre-Industrial skeletal and fossil records and seldom seen in modern day aboriginal societies. Human malocclusion (HM), now pandemic in industrialized cultures, is a relatively recent phenomenon. Changed cradle to grave dietary strategies characteristic of cultural industrialization seem to play a role in the increased prevalence of skeletal-dental HM. This course describes how antecedents to HM can initially be detected in early childhood, possibly during fetal development, then addressed with orthopedic intervention and non-retractive orthodontic/dentofacial orthopedic intervention strategies. Interestingly, for mutual pediatric patients who suffered from habitual mouth-breathing and enlarged adenoids, some of these early intervention regimens had been effectively in use since the mid/late-19th Century with close collaboration between physicians and dentists.

- Improve naso-respiratory ability in children who are in the primary or early mixed dentition with co-morbid retrusive and constrictive malocclusion using non-retractive orthodontic/dentofacial orthopedic intervention strategies.

About the Speaker: Kevin Boyd, D.D.S., M.Sc., is a board-certified pediatric dentist practicing in Chicago, IL. He is an attending instructor in the residency-training program in pediatric dentistry at Lurie Children's Hospital, where he additionally serves as a dental consultant to the Sleep Medicine Service. Prior to completing his dental degree from Loyola University Chicago College of Dentistry in 1986, he obtained an advanced degree (M.Sc.) in human nutrition from Michigan State University, where his research interests were focused on unhealthy eating, dental caries, obesity and diabetes. Dr. Boyd attended the University of Iowa for his post-graduate residency training where he received a Certificate in Pediatric Dentistry in 1988. Dr. Boyd has served on the teaching faculties of the University of Illinois College of Dentistry, University of Michigan College of Dentistry, University of Chicago Hospital, Rush Presbyterian-St. Luke's Medical Center and Michael Reese Hospital as an attending clinical instructor. He is currently completing pre-requisite course work in biological anthropology at Northeastern Illinois University in preparation for graduate study and research in the newly emerging discipline of evolutionary medicine. His clinical focus is centered upon prevention of oral and systemic disease through promotion of healthy breathing and eating.
